



NJY Camps - COVID FAQ's (April 2021)

Will my child need to be tested for COVID before camp?

YES - we are requiring a PCR test before camp and will be doing a second round of testing on site.

Where should we go to have our child tested in the tri-state area?

NJY Camps will have four locations in the tri-state area on June 27th & July 25th for testing. If you choose to utilize one of these sites, the results will be sent directly to camp, alleviating the need for follow-up and concerns with regards to timing.

Where should we go for testing outside of the tri-state area?

Find a local PM Pediatrics or any other testing facility of your choosing. Be mindful of the time it will take for camp to receive your results. Results must be uploaded into your [NJYHome](#) account prior to the first day of camp.

Will there be bus transportation service to camp?

NO, every child will need to be driven to camp. Drop off will look similar to a school drop off line.

Can we bring our trunks and duffels with us on the first day?

NO, all luggage must be either shipped or dropped to camp prior to your child's first day of camp.

Will there be a visiting day this summer?

NO, we will have a virtual visiting day from July 13-18 where each child will have a 20 minute zoom session with their parents/guardians.

How will food be served in the dining hall?

Food will be served cafeteria style with campers going up to the serving line by bunk to pick up their meal.

How will campers be seated in the dining hall?

Campers will sit by bunk in the dining hall. Tables will be at least 6 feet apart.

Will there be a salad bar in the dining hall?

NO, we will have individual salads made for lunch and dinner.

Are we required to send masks?

YES, every child should be sent to camp with one box of 50 disposable masks.

When will masks be required?

Masks will not be required in the bunk, in the dining hall, at the pool or at the lake. Further guidelines will be followed based on CDC and PA Dept of Health regulations.
